

Social Skills Rubrics: Problem-Solving

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These rubrics were designed to help counselors, teachers, social workers, or SLPs keep track of a student's progress on problem-solving goals. The set includes 7 rubrics in both a teacher and student version (for a total of 14 rubrics + 2 blank ones to customize). Rubrics are presented in Microsoft Powerpoint Format, so the wording can be customized to fit your students' ability levels and needs. Also, you can use Powerpoint's printing settings to print multiple rubrics per page. Great for when you have multiple students working on the same goal!

- Fact and Opinion
- Dealing with Disagreements
- Dealing with Gossip

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
